3 April 2022

Human Development Department Commissioner, Nitin Patil, became aware of the problems faced by the tribal people and their way of life. Through the platform of the Mahamanav Baba Amte Vikas Sanstha, innovative initiatives for tribal upliftment have been launched.

The struggle for education, health, and livelihood means the complete fulfilment of these three critical aspects of life, which is human development. On one side, there is the struggle for survival; on the other, there is the instability that arises from the creation and employment issues. Providing security to the lives of ordinary people in a society with such contradictions and achieving their development through understanding their problems and finding solutions to them through human development is what human development means. Two months ago, Sir Nitin Patil visited Shrigonda to understand the issues of people in rural areas through human development and find alternative solutions to those problems. On the day of Gudi Padwa, I received a phone call from the Ahmednagar Police Commissioner asking me to meet him. He further said, he was interested in meeting our organisation. The Commissioner said he looked forward to celebrating the Padwa festival with the tribal children.

Around 8 a.m., I received a call from Nitin Patil Sir, and he said he wanted to meet Police Superintendent Manoj Patil from Ahmednagar. Please check whether Manoj sir has time to meet us. Adv Shyam Asava had called Manoj Patil Sir and told us to come to his house.

Mr Nitin Patil introduced himself and shared information about the ongoing work in human development across 27 districts. The discussion revolved around issues such as the tribal question, self-help groups, and education for girls. In the context of human development, the conversation explored how we can address these issues and how people experiencing poverty can benefit from it. The discussion lasted for two hours. Moving ahead, our journey took us towards Snehakur, Adv Shyam Bhau, Dr Girish Kulkarni, and Balasaheb Warule, who provided detailed information about the work of Snehakur. Shri Khadesahab, Ajit Kulkarni, and Anam Prem arrived as our conversation continued. The Commissioner for Disabled Welfare with disabilities also met Anam Prem during his visit.

At Snehankur, Baloo sir gave us some well-prepared Puran Poli, and after finishing the meal, a discussion session on various topics began. Mr Khade and Mr Nitin Patil had worked together in a department, and at that time, Mr Nitin Patil was the commissioner of that department.

We reached Dr A.P.J. Abdul Kalam Library at Shrigonda at four o'clock, where the aspirants preparing for the competitive exams eagerly awaited sir. Sir is invited once a week at Yashada to conduct a lecture. In the small space of Kulkarniwada, we put the table and chair for sir. But sir refused to sit on the chair and chat with the aspirants seated on the ground. The discussion was held on various topics, including the approach, planning and how to prepare for the exam. To help them feel refreshed, we took them to the home of More Madam at 5:15 pm. Once we arrived at their home, we suggested that they try to relax. We also offered them a cup of tea, which they seemed to appreciate. When the Sir mentioned that he was feeling refreshed, More Madam and Jamdar's family felicitated Sir. From there, we travelled to the Kashti Bhilla settlement. We conversed in a particular context where we saw the situation and discussed what we could do. They usually do not have a caste certificate for several years; as a primary measure, we distributed caste certificates. We received special assistance from the local Sarpanch, Gram Panchayat, Tehsildar, and Sub-Divisional Officer to obtain the caste certificates. With their kind efforts, we will soon complete the process of obtaining all the necessary certificates.

Ms Sunanda Raut, who worked on the Dombari settlement, awaited us. All the women had gathered a discussion on how to conduct programmes and organise self-help groups. Rajur Project Department's Mr Pandit Kadam was present during the discussion on the issues of health and child education.

The children from the tribal community were excited to see what the Government vehicle and the Officer were like. Everyone was eagerly waiting and watching. His dedication to serving pridefully and connecting with everyone made him easy to approach, and he enjoyed engaging with tribal children. Sir also provided information to all the children about the National Institute of Naturopathic Medicine. Through this, the decision was to send children for a one-year free training program in natural treatment and yoga therapy. Sir also explained to all the children the benefits of natural medicine. They explained how they could stand on their own feet using various methods. Anil Gawade Sir, Gawli Sir, Vikas Sir, Mrs Shubhangi, Rani Madam, and Mrs Ashwini have considered the benefits of the Naturopathy Center. How can the children in our organization participate in yoga and naturopathy centres, and how can they stand on their own feet quickly?

Sir gave us some references regarding the handloom weaving saree. We can inspire children to pursue such activities. On Tuesday, we will visit the organization's Naturopathy Centre, which is meant for larger children. Sir also demonstrated Naturopathy to children. In addition, 18-year-old students were provided information on several courses necessary to stand on their own feet. We were also given greetings for Gudi Padwa and the Marathi New Year. We will never forget the fundamental guidance we received from Sir while having dinner with tribal children. That department will soon become innovative if such people are in government administration. We have faith that many social issues will be quickly resolved.

Sir honoured all nine tribal students who appeared in the SSC board exams first from their generation. All the students paid their respects to the sir. The children also enjoyed taking photos with the sir near the Government vehicle. Sir assured everyone that he would visit their families once with utmost certainty. The meeting with the sir will be unforgettable.



4 April 2022

Mahamanav Baba Amte's service organization's students went on a field visit at various regional places in Pune

Mr Nitin Patil, the Commissioner for Human Development, organized a regional meeting for 25 students who had completed 15 years of service at the Mahamanav Baba Amte Service Institution. The purpose of this regional meeting

was to encourage students to stand on their own feet and become self-sufficient. In reality, Tribal - nomadic community face unemployment even after education. If these 18-year-old students are properly guided, they can find good jobs. They can even become self-employed. Therefore, research on such courses has been carried out, and a meeting has been arranged for them at this place.

National Institute of Naturopathy

A one-year course is available at the National Institute of Naturopathy in Pune, and upon completion, students can quickly get a job with the government's help. The National Institute of Naturopathy informed students that they could treat any disease using natural remedies without taking any medication. Many of the institute's students are tribal people, and they treat diseases using natural remedies. Many of them wanted students to complete the course.

Center for Tribal Research

We should know the culture in which we grew up. Saheb had planned to visit the Tribal Institute of Research Centre. At this time, various folk arts, folk dances, paintings, sculptures etc., in the tribal society made the students realize that their culture was very deep. Seeing many things, the children felt that we should preserve our culture.

Guidance by Retired Colonel – Devbhankar

After this, the students met with Colonel Ravindra Devbhankar sir between 2.30 pm. Colonel Devbhankar, the sir, is a special friend of Nitin Patil sir. What exactly are the Police, Army? How to prepare it? Also, this guidance session was organized so the children understand where they get training. It was only when Mr Patil visited the institute that many of the students the institute wanted to pursue their careers in police and military. Col. Rabindraji Devbhankaraya provided valuable guidance. While guiding children at this time, set your goals, set your goals according to your intelligence, and focus your efforts on the goals. Even if there is a failure, he advised preparing again without getting tired. For this, he explained many things in simple language, such as getting up and exercising daily, keeping the body flexible, doing different exercises, and preparing for exams like climbing trees. Rural children sometimes need more confidence. In that case, such students should refrain from reading papers out loud, addictions and bad things, and keep their hair thin. Similarly, it would help if you chose NCC from the 8th or 11th standard so that your ground practice is done correctly. For this, tribal students are given three free months of training under the Shabari tribal scheme at Buldhana by Colonel Saheb's organization. Colonel Saheb said that this training could greatly benefit the institute's students, and he will provide all possible help to the students.

Punyadham Ashram - Trichoderma Lab

Students visited the Punyadham Ashram in Kothrud, where Santosh Chavan has opened a natural fungus lab called Trichoderma. A farmer's soil quality can be maintained well if he uses natural ingredients. For this, Chavan sir has been travelling from Washim to Pune for the past twenty years and has started such labs in many places. Nitin Patil sir expressed his desire that the students of his institution should get self-employment by starting this kind of lab. And for that, he had appointed Sampark Chavan, sir. On this occasion, the institute's students visited the entire Punyadham Ashram and inspected the school. Santosh Chavan Sir is doing various experiments of natural farming for many farmers of Pune through Punyadham Ashram, which has multiple activities like an old age home, cow shed, and lab. Many of his articles are published in the Sakal Agrovani newspaper. Several times a month, they organize camps for various youths of Maharashtra. The children visited this place and learned about different types of agriculture. And a discussion was also held with sir about whether such a lab can be done in our institution. Mr Nitin Patil gave his precious one day to the tribal children. Saheb's efforts to make his tribal children self-employed, use their technology, and create their own identity and place in society felt special.

Prays, Hopes, Begs When you become an officer, you will follow the thoughts of Bharat Ratna Dr APJ Abdul Kalam. I got a message from Dr Bharat Watwani (Ramon Magsaysay Award Winner) ten days ago that I want to understand your organisation's work; Dr Prakash Amte and Dr Girish Kulkarni Snehalaya have given me an idea about you. The pleasure of meeting Dr Bharat Watwani (Ramon Magsaysay Award winner) was a blessing in disguise for us. Seven years ago, on the premises of the Mehta family, we started the first college in the taluka in Shrigonda. So far, 34 students have entered the administration from this college. It was decided to shift the library facility of Mahamanav Baba Amte Sanstha to the first Kulkarni Wada.

Many donors have extended their helping hands, in which Mrs Sudha Uttamchad Lodha's contribution is beyond words. Regular helpers Sadhana Samarth, Veena Chalke, Mrs Kamalbai Bora Parivar, Shrigonda Local Farsi shopkeepers, Kalyani Pathak Walgude, Seva Sahyog Foundation, Kate Agro Food Industries, Shree Joshi Saheb, tube light from Itamx Industries, Fans from Konga Software Company through Ashwini Shinde, Furniture from Shalinitai Makhija, etc. was played a significant role in changing the shape of competitive exam centre.

Now 40 boys and girls from rural areas are coming to Abhyasika continuously. One thousand extra for competitive exams, reading books are available, and a Wi-Fi facility is provided to the students. In just 15 days, the centre's work was completed with the help of all the aspirants in the competitive exam centre.

On May 27, 2022, Dr Bharat Watwani (Ramon Magsaysay awardee) inaugurated the Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Study Library. While inaugurating the inauguration ceremony of Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Study Library, Dr Watwani gave the competitive exam takers a basic mantra to work for the country.

While interacting with the student, he communicated as follows.

Dr APJ Abdul Kalam would have thought he would be delighted to go to America with his education, but he stayed in his motherland. He said that when our Indian people go to America today, they become Americans. Dr Abdul Kalam was a person who lived in India and dedicated his life to the country of India. Today you all students are preparing for the competitive exams; by giving the exam, you will pass, and you will go to a higher position, but what you have done for the country of India is very important. I felt the question, so I started working for the country with education, health, and all facilities we should work for that motherland. He said if we can't do anything, then we are criminals. 18 June 2022

We passed 10th, after our three generations,

Even after 75 years of independence, there has been no significant change in the life of the Phasye Pardhi community, who have lived a primitive, neglected and despised life for centuries. Mahamanav Baba Amte Bahuuddeshiya Samajik Seva Sanstha at Shrigonda (District Ahmednagar) has been active for the last 15 years to change this situation. Especially for the children and youth of the Phasye Paradhi community, the organisation is doing the essential constructive work honestly and consistently by getting the support of society.

Many positive changes have taken place and are taking place in the post-independence period in various backward groups of society. The nomadic and liberated tribal dice society is no exception. However, lakhs of boys and girls belonging to nomadic and disenfranchised communities of the country still need to be put in the scope of education. Initiatives like the Right to Education Act and the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan spread awareness of education; However, even today, the development of the nomadic society has not been freed from the problems arising from the influence of various types of superstitions, undesirable social norms and traditions, chauvinism, innumerable urbanisation, economic and social inequality.

09 students of Mahamanav Baba Amte Institute were studying in class 10th. This was the largest batch of the institute. Vishal Bhosle was a mischievous child who came to study in Class 1. In Class 1, he ran away from the institution along with Raghu alias Ranveer for 42 km. We looked for him all night but found him the next day in the afternoon; he was found on their sail.

Ranveer Bhosle and Arjun Udashya Bhosle are true brothers. When his mother brought the children to the institute, we couldn't even see his birth certificate. At that time, I asked their mother what their names were, and then their mother said one brother's name was Raghu, and the other's name was Sattur. There was no Aadhaar card to check their names. Then, they went and changed their names: Raghu's Ranveer and Sattur's Arjun.

Kohinoor Kale comes in the third standard. The clothes were torn, he looked thin and had long hair. He doesn't know what he is talking about. At that time, his mother used to beg for food on the train and at the station, along with these children who were lost at the station used to go in the same direction. Studying in the standard 4th, Kohinoor ran away from the institute to Dombivli; he was found at the station. Now Kohinoor has become a very understanding boy.

Kale Hrithik is a 5th-class student; what to say about him? He was mischievous and quarrelsome. Once he reached Ranjangaon Masjid on a bicycle. He ran away too many times; he must have gone at least 40 times by now. However, he was brought into the institution and kept in the stream of education.

Chavan Prashant, a student of class 7, is very quiet, calm, engaged in his studies, and never mischievous. He is a consultant for the institute's agriculture as she belongs to agriculture.

Gore Ganesh, a boy from the tribal Bhill community, joined the institute in class 7. He used to cry several times but remained in the original flow. Gaikwad Eknath came to the institution in the 8th grade from the Bhill community. A quiet, reserved, non-talking child, he used to work as a daily wage worker when two years passed in Covid. When he was brought from home one day at night, he passed the 10th standard entrance.

Abhay Kale came to the institution in 8th standard from Parner taluka. He was brilliant. He got a scholarship in 8th standard. All these were the first students of the first batch of the institute. When they came to the institution, they did not know about toilets. The bathroom was a new subject for him. This group lives in the forest, far away from mainstream society. This is the first student to pass 10th for the first time from his three generations. Due to his 10th pass, at least his next generation will be seen in the competition.

Schools were closed for the last two years due to Corona. But last year the school started again, and by properly using the opportunity, everyone studied and achieved this success.

Zilla Parishad Primary School, Shrigonda paid particular attention to these nine students, especially Ranveer, Arjun, and Vishal; all three students stayed in the institute for ten years.

His mother and father are pleased to see his result today.

Mumbai Parivar's Educational Helping Hand of Sensitive Seva Sahyog Foundation to Tribal Poor Needy Meritorious Students.

On the occasion of the birth anniversary of Rajarshi Shahu Maharaj, Seva Sahyog Foundation Parivar Mumbai distributed school kits to 350 students of Mahamanav Baba Amte Sanstha, Arambh Bal Niketan, Sadhana Bal Bhavan, Vidyarthi Sahayyak Samiti project. Seva Sahyog Foundation Parivar Mumbai has supported Mahamanav Baba Amte Seva Sanstha in providing educational school kit material for the last seven years. Seva Sahyog Parivar has been distributing school kits to poor students far away from education every year. This help is given mainly to poor, needy students in rural areas. Every year, Seva Sahyog provides school kits to one lakh students in two parts of tribal villages. The service association also carries out many women's health and industry-related activities.

Three projects of Mahamanav Baba Amte Sanstha are working on children's education. A total of over 350 students are receiving education in three projects, namely Residential Student Auxiliary Committee Hostel, Aramba Balvidya Niketan Dombari for Boys and Girls Bal Bhavan Kashti and Sadhana Bal Bhavan Shrigonda. Due to many students, the institution has to work hard every year to get educational materials. But all the students are getting this school kit through Seva Sahyog.

On Rajarshi Shahu Maharaj's birth anniversary, Seva Sahyog Foundation school kits were distributed in all three projects. Srigonda Taluka Police Inspector Ram Rao Dhikle, Microbiologist Bharti Sable, and Guruvarya Keshav Modwe Sir, in their presence, school kits were distributed.

Ramrao Dhikle Saheb, Police Inspector of Srigonda Taluka, wished the children a new academic year. The current situation in the tribal community in the taluka is improving, and juvenile crime in the taluka has been curbed only because of the residential project of the organisation. If there is any cooperation from the police system, we will help as much as needed. I was happy to see the discipline and academic progress of the children in the institution. Saheb expressed the hope that the aid received is a social debt and should be extended to such poor and needy children after getting a job. Bharti Sable Education is the basis of life. You cannot separate yourself from education. Every person is an essential book of education. You need to know what to take from him. Education is the key to survival. What is life? Why live life, how to live life, what is the meaning of life, how to fulfil life. What should we take from life, and what should we give to others? The answer to all these questions is education. Learn by doing actual experiments instead of just parroting, he advised. 'Education is everything, for that one must get an education first', Mr Bharti Sable told all the children about the importance of education. Guruvarya Keshav Modwe Sir shed light on the life of Rajarshi Shahu Maharaj and gave information about his educational contribution. At this time, Hon. Keshav Modwe Sir, Vikas Patil and, Anil Sasane, Sunanda Raut was present.

28 July 2022

On the occasion of the 14th anniversary of Mahamanav Baba Amte Sanstha and the birth anniversary of Lokmanya Tilak, Health Camp and Bal Sanskar Camp were organised on behalf of the Aakar Foundation and SSY Parivar.

Aakar Foundation and SSY Parivar Pune have been associated with the organisation for the last four years. This family organises one or two Bal Sanskar camps annually for the organisation's children. Due to Corona, there was some break in this camp for the last two years, but now 130 children from the institute have returned as the school has started completely. This camp was organised for Complete Health Checkups. The camp began at 9 am. Children were divided into different age groups. Groups were divided into three categories. The camp observed the Health screening of the children. All the boys and girls were examined for their health, and medicines were distributed. A separate list was prepared for skin diseases, eye diseases, dental diseases, and stammering. It was decided to show these children to a specialist Doctor in Pune. Similarly, it was decided to take a blood group and haemoglobin test at the earliest. Apart from this, a review meeting was held to schedule the children's food, breakfast and lunch and what and how much should be given.

Making Rakhi for Raksha Bandhan Festival:

In this camp, children were taught how to prepare rakhis. Maithili Tai Kulkarni and Snehal Tai taught the children how to make Rakhis in the morning session. This time nearly 1500 Rakhis were made by the children in three different groups, and these Rakhis were sent by post to the well-wishers of the organisation and the soldiers.

The organisation of various sports:

Different games were organised in the afternoon session. Games like bursting balloons, jumping and eating Jalebi hanging from a rope, dancing to local songs, chattering local songs and Ram-Ravana, Kabaddi etc., were conducted for primary children. The kids had a lot of fun with it.

Tree plantation camp:

Camp workers planted ten coconut trees on the institute's premises adjacent to the hostel.

Cricket Match for Secondary Students:

Secondary school students played a cricket match. It was raining a little, but the children enjoyed the game in the light rain.

Collective practice of meditation

Collective meditation was held in the evening. Sameer sir briefly explained the importance of meditation and prayer on this occasion. After dinner, a Hindi Dubbed movie called Panda was shown to everyone. Through this film, Sameer Naik sir told the meaning of the film to the children. And here are some examples of what kind of movies we should watch.

***Second Day* Guidance session:**

In the session on the second day, as a guide to secondary school children, Dr Prasad Ambikar and Sameer Naik sir guided in a few words about health, what are the moral values of life and how to preserve them? At the same time, primary children discussed manners and how to take care of their health.

Scholarship under Vidya Vardan initiative to student Gauri Zodge:

So far, six students have been helped with higher vocational education through this initiative initiated by Kirtimalini Tai. Through this, Madhuritai helped Gauri Zodge with an annual scholarship of Rs 26000 for her annual education this year. This scholarship was given by Sameer Naik Sir, founder of the Aakar Foundation. This camp concluded after a group lunch.





11 August 2022

Rakshabandhan for environmental protection :

Rakshabandhan is the bond of brother-sister love!

Rakshabandhan is the bond of brother-sister love! On this day, a sister ties a rakhi on her brother's hand and wins her brother's heart. This festival is a combination of prowess, love, adventure and patience. In all relationships in the world, brother-sister love is selfless and sacred. The Festival of Rakshabandhan was celebrated in Mahamanav Baba Amte Organisation.

Last week, Maithili Tai from Aakar Foundation and SSY trained boys and girls to make rakhi.

Beginning of Raksha Bandhan;

Like a last year, all the servants of the police department, including police inspector Dhikle Saheb and the jail inmates, were tied rakhis by the tribal girls of the institution.

Dr Kakade and Dr Rode, who protects children's health in the regular institution, tied rakhis and applied "Tilak" on the forehead.

Environmentally Friendly Rakshabandhan

Villa Natarajan and Srilata are closely associated with the organisation. They sent all the rakhi materials from Melghat and gave the slogan "Shika, Banwa, Vika, Srishtibandh" (meaning Learn, Make, Sell, Create) to complement the environment.

All rakhis contain materials made from environmental supplements, trees, vines, etc. Vikas, Shubhangi, Ashwini, Prasad, and all the activists made hundred eco-friendly rakhis this morning after watching the video of Srishtibandh. After the rakhis were prepared, all the tribal women and boys who came to the organisation were told about the importance of the environment. All the tribal women and children of the institution were given the idea that we were tying a rakhi to the tree to protect the tree by waving it.

During the time of Covid-19, people died because people did not get oxygen; at that time, there was a shortage of oxygen. We also told tribal children and tribal women the importance of trees to survive so humans can get enough oxygen.

All the tribal women and children happily tied rakhis to 250 trees in the institution and celebrated the festival of Raksha Bandhan.

Tribal women and all the institution's children also swore to protect the environment. Environmental protection is the need of the hour, and social protection and the environment are our responsibility. Tribal women and boys and girls tied rakhis to the trees and gave the message of environmental protection to society.

An unforgettable day

Some days become 'moons' and live forever in the sky of mind, and this day is 2nd September 2022. 2nd September is the birth centenary of my friend Anushree Bhide's father, who has the potential to surpass even Karna in philanthropy. So on this very day (yesterday), she wanted to help some needy, creditable persons/organisations by visiting them in person.

Accordingly, Ashok Sharma of Belwandi village in Ahmednagar district (Paan Tapariwala, who has been organising rural literary gatherings in the village for the last 19 years) and Anant Zende established the 'Mahamanav Baba Amte Bahuuddeshiya Samajik Seva Sanstha', which provides education to the homeless children of Ghugalvadgaon, Srigonda, and brings them into the mainstream of the society. She decided to visit them and give them one lakh rupees each. When I asked her why she was coming, I hesitated for a moment as she would travel for twelve to thirteen hours in a single day (in her car, of course), but when I heard that her husband, Anand Bhide, age 85, was ready to come happily as usual, I cleared my doubts.

We left Thane at 5 in the morning and reached Ashok Sharma's house at 12:30 in the afternoon via Chakan. Ananta (Zhende), who introduced Sharma, was already there with one of his students. Ashok Sharma and his mother (Ranjanatai) were so happy they couldn't sleep for two days because of our arrival. Even if we said not to do anything, there was a lot of kheer-puri, potato bhaji, varan-bhat, papad, and curdaya ready. Some of the former officials of Gram Panchayat came to visit us especially. Deputy Sarpanch Dahake spoke on the phone. Both of us were gifted a saree by Belwandi village (as the name of Belwandi village was brought to Maharashtra from the newspaper article). 'Dongre Mama' of Khodad village had travelled two and a half hours by bus to meet us. My sister, my 4-5 friends, and I had brought gifts like sweaters, ear caps, sarees, shirts, some groceries and some sweets. The main thing is that the people of Gram Panchayat told everyone they would try to get Rs.200000 from the 'Prime Minister's Housing Scheme' for Ashok Sharma. Ananta and Dongremama are going to follow up on it. Hearing this, Sharma hoped the old house would stand again. After bidding farewell to Sharma, we left for Shrigondia with Ananta to see his institution. First, she is a student who lives in the very ancient Kulkarni Wada (where Anant's work began). Many boys and girls from the grassroots level were studying in this study which was started by repairing the palace so that the children of Panchkroshi could study in peace. The dreams of these children unfolded by speaking; the hard work they take for it will make everything mute!

In the 400 years old palace next to this palace, there is a paduka and a monastery of Gondawalekar Maharaj's disciple Prahlad Maharaj; after seeing him, we left towards Ghugalvadgaon. Ananta and his colleagues have built heaven with the participation of the people on this six-and-a-half acre land taken from the Sarvakaryeshu initiative of Loksatta. The lives of 130 children of the Phasye-Pardhi community, who had no sense of education for many generations and considered theft and crime as their livelihood, are taking a new turn here. There are many facilities that they have never dreamed of seeing, like computers, solar systems, bunk beds to sleep in, bus to go to school and play equipment like playgrounds, slides, mallakhamb etc. are available there. Cotton, millet, and wheat were grown on the three acres of land on the side. Vegetables like okra, cabbage, and flower were also ready to be cut. The farm pond, which makes this farm green, was also filled to the brim. The most liked thing is that the children from class VIII to X here work on this farm and is paid Rs.20 per hour for their hard work. Anant's wife, Shubhangi, guides these children.

Those children coming from school, washing and drying their lunch boxes, listening attentively to what (I said) and answering, saying 'bye-bye, come again' as they go, are not moving in front of their eyes. I should stay here for one night to experience and unlearning of things. Something to say, something to listen to, We started our return journey at half past six in the evening. Coming out of that green, pollution-free environment, I returned around 11:30 PM to my usual hectic life. But yesterday's zing still seems to have not taken off. Everyone should see these pilgrimage sites that make society and strengthen its creative hands. Do you feel the same way?

For many days I wanted to visit the Baba Amte Institute; I had heard so about the institute from many administrative officers. After today's visit, I realised that while living in society, we should live with the feeling that we have to give to the community. Keeping this feeling, Anant Zende and his colleagues are doing the work; therefore, our society is moving forward.

Education is the key to an ideal life.

If a person wants to become a good person and create his existence, education is essential. Take this time. District Judge Mujeeb Sheikh presented educating thoughts about Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar and shed light on his life. One must preserve the character and keep the self in youth. Everyone needs to protect their character. These days' serious mistakes are made by children, even very young. Once a mistake is made, there is no going back. Nothing can be done once the time has passed. We are also deeply saddened that, as human beings if a 19-year-old is serving a life sentence. For this, we should all decide and focus only on education, leaving aside all other frivolous subjects. A student should work hard and strive to become the successful and make her/his parents' proud. Self-existence must be created. Despite the knowledge of the criminal background, we should forget everything because our parents went into it due to circumstances. If we consider the current situation, children with poor backgrounds work in high administrative positions. Because they see it as an opportunity and not a crisis, earlier, it was not customary to educate women, but now educating tribal girls is necessary. But many social reformers recognised the need for women's education and gave them the right to education. But even today, tribal women are deprived of education. Their learning rate is negligible. Seeing the girls getting an education in this institution, the picture is that all the tribal girls will get an education soon. Do not marry them at a young age, many people develop problems at a young age, many cases bring tears to our eyes. Take one saree less and fight for education instead of fighting with your husband over the saree. Give the girls a book and pencil if you can't bring them to the institution; it is committed to teaching them.

Educate children, don't make them criminals.

At the Tribal Parents' Gathering on behalf of the court, sarees were distributed to tribal mothers, and Diwali snacks and fruits were distributed. On Diwali, Saree on Bhaubij and Diwali Faral were distributed to tribal mothers by District Judge Mujeeb Saheb, Teacher Jayashree More, Adv. Harshal Lohkare, Adv. Sangram Deshmukh. Fruits were also broadcast on behalf of Srigonda Court. At this time, the tribal mothers were moved to tears. On this occasion, exemplary teacher Jayashree More guided the parents present. Responding to it, parents also expressed their feelings. District Judge Mujeeb Shaikh, and Teacher Jayashree More, graced the program. Adv. Harshal Lohkare, Adv. An endless stream of enlightenment

The first chapter of the Mahamanav Baba Amte Prabodhan lecture series, if emotional intelligence is developed, the rate of depression and suicide will decrease. - Dr Yash Velankar

26 December 2022

Shrigonda:- Emotional intelligence can be developed. But we should create emotional intelligence in our children because emotional intelligence is essential for success. While giving an example, Dr Yash Velankar mentioned Gandhiji. Gandhiji had great emotional intelligence. Satyagraha was born in Africa. Gandhiji stayed in Africa for advocacy. And we all know the story of their experience while getting a train ticket there. Gandhiji was not only a lawyer but more than that; he was intelligent and wise. As his emotional intelligence developed, he sat on the train, and his experience on the train led to the rise of satyagraha in Africa. At that time, if Gandhiji had got up in anger, it would have taken many more years for the world to understand satyagraha. So we should explore our anger in daily life. Today we see young people committing suicide in anger. We are experiencing the same situation in urban and rural areas. On this occasion, Dr Yash Velankar told the statistics of accidental deaths and suicides due to corona in the last few years. It has been found that the number of people committing suicide is very high. The leading cause of suicide is not teaching children how to cope with adversity. Therefore, it is said that this young generation is committing suicide due to depression. That is, their emotional intelligence is not developing. We give everything to our children so that we do not want our children to suffer the hardships we face while standing on our feet. As a result, the emotional intelligence of our children does not develop. That is why today we see the young generation committing suicide if something goes against their will; parents should be aware.

We must be mindful of what we are doing emotionally. We must judge our feelings. If we hold it down, we will suffer from it. Acts taken in haste are always dangerous. An act done without thinking about the feeling is to have fun. This only causes mental anguish and damage.

At this time, Dr Velankar gave Bahinabai's example and explained the meaning of "Mann Vadhaya Vadhaya". If there is no emotional intelligence, mental disorders emerge. Then a psychiatrist is needed. The various parts explain the natural concept of how the feelings of men and women are formed from the beginning. Today, the number of people suffering from depression-anxiety is increasing daily. It is much higher in big cities. Depression-anxiety is an altered activity in the brain. Sometimes depression can be cured by psychiatrists, but if the depression is too deep, then medication is needed. No one can go deeper into depression than we learn how to cope with adversity. Counselling can turn the person around.

Today we mostly do intellectual work. But not paying attention to your body is a concern, so if you want to maintain mental health, you must take care of your body. We should pay attention to our breath. He also said that if a person practices focusing on their breath for 20 minutes a day, they will experience structural changes in their brain.

After the end of the lecture, a question-and-answer program took place for about 45 minutes. The people of Shrigonda asked many questions, and their appropriate answers were given by Dr Yash Velankar. At the end of the program, Dr Velankar's honour was done by Dr Prakash Sheth, who chaired the program. Also, on this occasion, Asha Sevika was honoured as a representative of Shrigonda Taluka for her remarkable performance during the Corona period. Uddhav Gaikwad introduced the program, and Ghanshyam Anna Shelar delivered the vote of thanks. Kavi Chandrasekhar Patil moderated the program.

27 December 2022

Shrigonda:- Society needs to understand mass movement; no movement is for reward or honour. Mass movement is a susceptible area. Mass movement means to agitate oneself. But if we cannot mobilise society and the government, our work cannot become a mass agitator. That is why we get to see the origin of good institutions from this movement, said lecturer Medha Patkar. Also, the Narmada Bachao Andolan is a part of this mass movement. More than 6000 tribal children are learning and realising their future from the life school, which has been running for 36 years till date. Some of them have become officials.

A movement is neither a march nor a slogan, or something is done for momentary fame. But the definition of agitation is different from this. It has the power to create. A framework of values is a direction of movement. The struggle for the underprivileged to get justice should be based on the system. The farmers' agitation for the Agrarian Act was adequate. But many lost their lives in this. Ninety-five percent of society is exploited by many people at the bottom. Wealth has been concentrated in the hands of a handful of people, leading to the erosion of social inequality. On the one hand, we see significant buildings. On the other hand, the largest slum in Asia can also be seen in the capital.

Today, the suicides of landless farmers and unemployed people are increasing daily. On the one hand, India is on the way to becoming a superpower, but the reality is quite different. India cannot become great without understanding this situation. We pride ourselves on being a democracy, but these people are not a handful of wealthy people. The hunger and thirst of low-income people cannot be satisfied by making laws alone. Even today, 81 per cent of people struggle to get just five kg of grain. The government needs an answer about what support should be given to the hungry. For this, it is necessary to take the basis of the Constitution. It is the primary duty of the government to satisfy the hunger of all, as mentioned in

the constitution. Even the Supreme Court ordered it, and it is not being implemented, so there is a need for public agitation; this fight is against the establishment.

The administration does not fulfil its responsibility; hence Who are the people in a democracy? This is the big question that arises here. It is wrong to make laws without thinking. Consequently, the farmers' movement emerged. In the direction of 2016, it was provided that there is no need to store grain in godowns; let's put some money in the account and end the ration system. No thumb is raised here online; conversely, the government is making arrangements to starve many people due to biometrics. It is better not to talk about corruption. We, as intelligent citizens, should recognise the need for a mass movement.

If you think about the water and environment today, you will realise how expensive a bottle of water is. Capitalism is causing environmental imbalances. Even in the heaviest rainfall areas like Cherrapunji, the water table has gone thousands of feet deep. The question is that whatever beauty of the environment has survived today, the same tribals seem to be suffering from thirst.

Marketisation has become the biggest weapon of the government. This market only knows the language of money. A democratic system is trying to become a monarchy. Therefore, to remove this disparity in society, it is necessary to take along the tribal-deprived - exploited group at the grassroots level.

Today even perennial rivers like Narmada are looking to dry up, because capitalists want their market to increase. Therefore, we have continued the fight for the Narmada Bachao Andolan for the last 36 years till today.

Environmental conservation is the need of the hour. It will not be understood only by reading books. A mass movement will have to be done for that. Many environmental agreements are made at world conferences, and resolutions are announced. Despite that, 41 coal mining rights have been opened up to companies. The tribal's living there at that time are not considered.

The naturally created treasury, which today overwhelms representative companies in democracies, is a severe matter. The condition of the rivers has also become dire. Reports and research are showing that river water is not potable.

After exploring the Narmada, many people came and listened to the discourse. But they should also think about the environmental conditions there. And resources should be conserved by raising voices against it. It is only possible to win this battle with a mass movement. "Ye azadi adhuri hain ek ladhai abhi baqi hai", so I must stand up as a protester.

The forest is the national wealth of the country. But in the last few years, many decisions have been taken regarding the forest area. The government can transfer any forest area without asking the Gram Sabha. But society should think about who will give this area. Who is the actual owner of the forest, Tribals or Capitalists? Is the government doing injustice to the tribals or giving them justice by driving them out of the forest? We should think of this as a conscious citizen. Many incidents of natural disasters are happening today due to environmental problems.

It will not be helpful for us to play a bystander role, but let us build a mass movement and fight together. Constitution is the lifeblood of justice and strengthening democracy. It is essential to understand the Constitution. For this, every youth must read the Constitution. Everyone should exercise the right to vote. Medha Patkar appealed to the audience that everyone should participate in democracy.

Wednesday, Date 28 December 2022

Prashant Deshmukh highlighted the theme 'Life is beautiful' while wrapping the last third chapter of the Mahamanav Baba Amte Prabodhan lecture series. On this occasion, while initially telling exciting stories from his domestic and personal life, he said that living for others, helping or cooperating with others, and at the same time, living would be beautiful.

He recited Mangesh Padgaonkar's poem 'Mazhya Prema, Jagan Sundar Ahe' on this occasion. It is beautiful to see with full eyes; her call comes from the valley; it comes from the wind; it is lovely to hear, my love; it is beautiful to live. Many great Personalities are not with us today, but still, they are with us with their work, so it is not riches and circumstances but the mood needed to make our life beautiful. Good thoughts are not required for survival. We should help someone to move forward without pulling them back. If not, we should not put any thorn in the way; only then will life be beautiful. We get to experience the true definition of social service as per Dutta Halsgikar's poem. Those whose garden blossomed should give two flowers. In this poem, those whose height is as high as the sky should come down a little.

Man's life has become ugly because man's happiness started to be based on others' pain. Therefore, the first measure to make life beautiful is to be able to take joy in the enjoyment of others.

That is, even if one fails while progressing, if the other is moving forward, he should consider it as his happiness and move forward. Such an attitude can be seen in earlier times. The joy of living is on our minds. Now there is a lot of grinding and turning tools. But 20 years ago now, we see a lot of differences. We experience true happiness at that time.

The present generation should let the children enjoy rural life. A rural lifestyle can make life beautiful. Life will be beautiful only if we convince children that it is a lie that the world is one of competition and that the world is one of cooperation.

Your speech should be sweet. If the tongue is appropriately used, the transformation will happen. Admitting a mistake is a sign of greatness. Similarly, he shed light on the life of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj while talking about Raigad Fort. He gave an example of how Maharaj used to understand his colleagues at that time.

At the end of the program, he also told about the incident of his visit to the fort of Pedgaon. We should show Raigad Fort to our children at least once. Similarly, if the youth succeeds and suddenly fails, he wishes to look at Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Agra's liberation and rise again.
